Scholarship appeal

There are limited educational opportunities for many young people in Covalima, especially for women and those is remote, rural communities. Since 2012, Friends of Suai/Covalima (FoSC) has funded more than 166 scholarships for students from Covalima district to further their studies at senior secondary schools, vocational training centres and universities in Timor-Leste. The scholarship program encourages gender equity and provides educational opportunities for students from disadvantaged families.

FoSC has made a commitment to fund ongoing scholarships and also offer 14 new scholarship places for the 2022 school year and **we need your help!**

All funds raised will benefit students and will contribute towards enrolment fees, training materials, equipment, transport, accommodation and pastoral care from the Education Coordinator.

It costs between \$250 and \$1700 per year of training to fund a scholarship but any amount is appreciated.

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2022 scholarship opportunities



The CCC is now registering and interviewing candidates to apply for vocational and tertiary scholarships for 2022 including primary teaching, construction and motorbike mechanical training. FoSC also hope to provide scholarships for secondary school graduates to continue their vocational study in agriculture and electrical studies. After the initial processes at the CCC, the Education Coordinator will facilitate successful candidates to attend testing and enrolment sessions at each training centre. An update on the outcomes will be provided early in 2022.

Scholarship update

There were 17 scholarships offered for the 2021 school year: 11 continuing and six new students. Fifteen of the students have been able to continue their study throughout the year, despite ongoing disruptions due to COVID-19 and severe weather events, and FoSC look forward to sharing pictures of graduation ceremonies scheduled in the coming weeks and months.

The students at Baucau Teachers College have been well supported throughout the year and have adapted well to online learning when needed. In 2021 there were seven students at the College, including two students who have recently completed their fourth year to complete the equivalent of a Bachelor of Education.

In recent years FoSC has offered places at the National University in Dili for students to complete tertiary study in Nursing (specialising in Midwifery) and Community Development. Most of the students have finished their fourth year of class studies but will not graduate until their proposals are approved and research projects are finalised. All of these activities were delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It is anticipated that most students will complete and graduate in 2022. The students have expressed their commitment to finish their studies, graduate and start working in the community.

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Training at the CCC

Many forums and training programs take place at the CCC, including English language and computer training courses delivered by the CCC staff and the Rural Women's Development Program leadership training for members of village councils. All training at the Centre now includes a health component, with training on hygienic practices including the importance of handwashing and social distancing. The participants are provided with bars of soap and WHO infographic posters about preventing COVID-19 transmission and are encouraged to share information with their friends and families.

Suai Secondary School library

More than 2,100 students and teachers at the Suai Secondary School use the school library, which was established through the Friendship. FoSC supporters continue to donate items to add to the collection and raise funds for the salaries of two librarians to manage the library resources.

The librarians and English language trainers at the CCC recently participated in a training course on installing and using KOHA library software to catalogue and manage the library materials. The trainers from the Xanana Gusmao Reading Room in Dili also provided a wi-fi router, barcode reader and collection of fiction books. The staff are now busy cataloguing the library collection.
