'Real-life' practical experience is an important part of learning in many vocational and tertiary training courses. FoSC scholarship recipients have been doing a range of practical placements this year.

Two students in their second year, and two students in their third year of study at Baucau Teachers College are currently doing six week placements at schools in Baucau and Covalima districts.

Another student is doing a Certificate I in motorbike mechanic training at Senai Becora and has recently started a one month practical placement. Two students completing a Certificate II in Hospitality at the vocational training centre in Suai are also currently doing a short placement to gain practical skills.

Practical placements prepare students for employment and there have been some great outcomes for students. Two recent graduates from Baucau Teachers College are now employed at Primary Schools in Covalima district and two students who completed a Certificate II in Hospitality in 2021 were offered employment in Dili and Suai.

Nurses finalising their post-grad studies

Since 2016, seven young women have received FoSC scholarships to study nursing at the National University in Dili. They have completed three years of nursing training and are now in the process of finishing their post-grad studies to specialise in Midwifery. Five of the students have had their research topics approved and are underway with completing their theses. They are doing their best to finalise everything and graduate this year. Two students are in the process of preparing their research topics and proposals.

The pandemic has caused significant delays to the completion date for these students, but we are encouraging them to finish and supporting them with the costs of their studies. They are motivated and very keen to share news of their completion and graduation this year.

With One Seed (WoS) reforestation program

The WoS program has continued to expand in Tilomar sub-district, with more nursery space built and more trees planted this year. In April 2022, a further 26,600 mahogany trees have been distributed, bringing the total number of planted trees to more than 43,000. The WoS team will continue to monitor their progress and provide training and support to the farmers who now own and maintain the trees.

We are committed to financially supporting this fantastic long-term initiative which will generate income for the tree owners for many years to come. Money raised by FoSC will fund the annual farmer tree payments later this month; with each farmer receiving 50 cents for each surviving tree that was planted in 2020 and 2021.

We are delighted that this year the European Union has announced the launch of their 'Rai Matak' (Green Lands) program, which will be funding the expansion of this fantastic reforestation project in new areas of Timor-Leste.
