1 December - 22 December 2005	Out: An exploration of sexual identity	A photographic diary by Paul Wallis and Ben Pokidin of the experiences of same sex attracted youth in the City of Port Phillip [A Same Sex Attracted Southern Youth Arts (SSASY) Project]
2 November - 30 November 2005	Leonard Gibbs	An exhibition of paintings and drawings, by local artist Leonard Gibbs, depicting scenes from and around Alma Park. Describing it as an oasis, the artist believes Alma Park to be a particularly unique piece of suburbia, with its visual diversity of the natural and manmade.
30 September - 28 October 2005	Matters of Substance	Substance is a publication produced by the City of Port Phillip that focuses on drug related issues in our community. Five talented artists, who have all been affected by drug use, exhibit work that has been featured in the publication. It is hoped that the exhibition will increase people's understanding of drug related issues in an enjoyable and informative way and aims to de-mystify drug use and challenge negative stereotypes of drug users.
3 August - 25 September 2005	Lesbian and Gay Family Portraits	Photographic artist Michaela Oliinyk seeks to

		document the diversity of lesbian and gay families, challenging the responses to the lesbian Mums on Playschool. The exhibition seeks to represent positive images that reflect the diversity that exists within the City of Port Phillip.
July 2005 - onwards	Due to the building works at St Kilda Town Hall, the Access Exhibition Space will be relocated to the portico area near the Brighton Road entrance to the Town Hall. The Space continues on around the adjacent corridor.	
6 July - 28 July 2005	Get a Street Life	A series of photographs taken by City of Port Phillip residents in response to the question "what happens in your street?". Accompanying text highlights reflections on the sense of community in local streets. A community building project by the CoPP Community Health team.
5 April - August 3 2005	'Bomb the Hall' Stencil Art Exhibition.	This exhibition brings the word of the streets to the heart of city hall. Prominent stencil artists such as Haha as well as works by local Albert Park College participants of stencil art workshops are sprayed straight onto the walls of the town hall. 7 March - 31 March 2005	Roomers with a View	A collection of photographs by rooming house residents in the City of Port Phillip depicting their view of their community.
8 February - 4 March 2005	Port Phillip Panorama - Paintings by members of the Emerald Hill Art Group	The Groups 4th annual exhibition in the Access Exhibition Space, this exhibition features more than forty paintings including self-portraits. The works include mixed media and acrylic, pastel and oil paintings around local themes - seascapes, cityscapes, and still-lives.
20 Dec 2004 - 24 Jan 2005	50 Years of Latvians in Australia	This exhibition will highlight 50 years of Australian Latvian Arts Festivals in Australia. The exhibition will include photography, graphic design work and traditional Latvian craft such as weaving, pottery, folk-costumes and jewellery.
