18. Accord	10	We have held regular Accord meetings every 6 weeks and meetings of the Accord steering committee in between.
19. Responsible Serving of Alcohol	10	We continue to provide RSA training for bar Staff of licensed venues in the CoPP
20. Drugs Round Table	19	We have held 5 DRTs this year. Guest speakers included Prof John Tombourou from Deakin University, Michael Livingston from the Alcohol Policy Centre at Turning Point, and Paul Smith, the head of DHS’ Drugs Policy & Services Branch.

22. Community Pulse – Community Participation	94	The community participation aspect continues to grow with the appointment of a volunteer Smile Spy coordinator. Smiles per Hour has also been launched in Darebin. Many other measures including bird counts and penguin egg counts are collected by community volunteers.

HEAT won the Prime Minister's Award for best Victorian Business-Community partnership and has recently secured an additional \$160,000 funding from the ANZ trustees.</b>
<b>30. Police – Review crime and safety audits</b>	<b>14</b>	<b>We analysed the CoPP's most feared public places via a random sample of 700 residents and met with senior police in November to determine a strategic response.</b>
<b>31. Police – Help police operations to improve safety/reduce crime</b>	<b>12</b>	<b>We met with senior police in November to discuss how we can continue to support their operations in 2008.</b>
<b>32. Street parties</b>	<b>1</b>	<b>Street parties continue to grow stronger in the City of Port Phillip. Last year's figure of 27 was the most we've had in one season.</b>
<b>33. Communication of local activities</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>This will be progressed in 2008</b>
<b>34. Food Security – Help Yourself Free Food Co-op</b>	<b>75</b>	<b>This project continues to grow stronger. As we get closer to Christmas, the volume of food collected per week has grown from approximately 300kg to over 500kg. More than a dozen local agencies now distribute the fresh food to the poor.</b>
<b>35. Food Security –CoPP Food Network</b>	<b>77</b>	<b>The lead on this has been taken up by the EcoCentre, which re-launched the project in November. The project will focus on the local production of food via public and private gardening. A new community garden is scheduled for the Park Towers estate in South Melbourne in 2008.</b>
<b>36. Food Security –Free &amp; Cheap Meals Guide</b>	<b>76</b>	<b>A new version of this guide has been updated.</b>
