The City of Port Phillip is located in Melbourne's inner southern suburbs, between 2 and 8 kilometres from the Melbourne GPO. The CoPP is bounded by the Cities of Melbourne and Stonnington in the north, the City of Glen Eira in the east, the City of Bayside in the south, and Port Phillip Bay and the City of Melbourne in the west.

The CoPP includes the suburbs of Albert Park, Balaclava, Elwood, Middle Park, Port Melbourne (part), Ripponlea, South Melbourne, St Kilda, St Kilda East (part), St Kilda West and part of the St Kilda Road area (Melbourne 3004).

The city has experienced a significant amount of residential development in the 1990s, particularly in areas close to the foreshore. A number of significant employment areas sit within Port Phillip, including the St Kilda Road office district and industrial, warehousing and manufacturing districts in South Melbourne and Port Melbourne.

The original inhabitants of the Port Phillip area were the Bunurong or Kulin Aboriginal people. European settlement dates from the 1840s, with development initially around the current centres of St Kilda, Port Melbourne and South Melbourne. Significant development occurred during the post-war years, when many migrants moved into the area and public housing estates were built. Rapid growth took place during the 1960s, aided by the construction of many flats and apartments. Growth continued throughout the 1980s and 1990s, as many industrial sites and surplus government and utility land were converted into residential use. The population increased from nearly 71,000 in 1991 to over 78,000 in 2001, then to over 85,000 in 2006. Most of this growth has been in the areas closest to the foreshore (Port Melbourne) and in the St Kilda Road area.



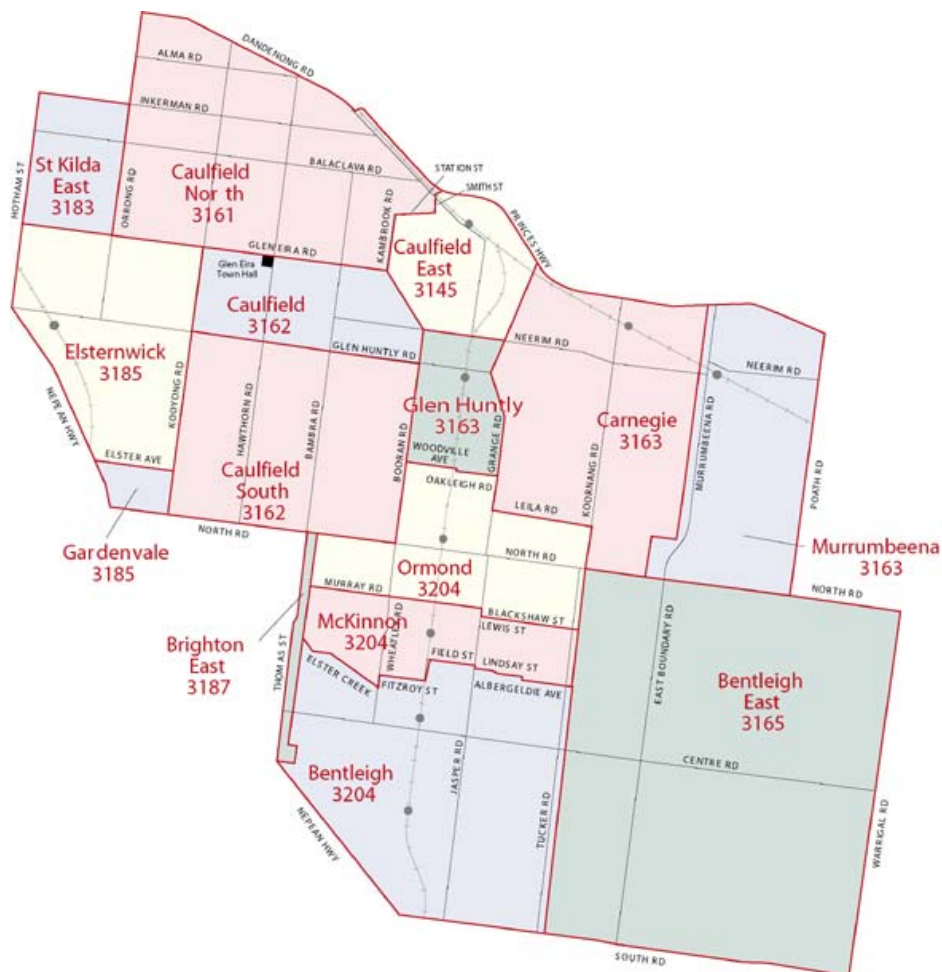
City of Glen Eira

The City of Glen Eira is located in Melbourne's south-east suburbs, about 7 kilometres from the Melbourne CBD. The City of Glen Eira is bounded by the City of Stonnington in the north, the City of Monash in the east, the City of Kingston in the south, and the Cities of Bayside and Port Phillip in the west. The City's boundaries are Dandenong Road in the north, Poath Road, North Road and Warrigal Road in the east, South Road in the south, and the Nepean Highway, Thomas Street, North Road, Hotham Street, Inkerman Street and Orrong Road in the west.

The City of Glen Eira includes the suburbs of Bentleigh, Bentleigh East, Carnegie, Caulfield, Caulfield East, Caulfield North, Caulfield South, Elsternwick, Gardenvale, Glen Huntly, McKinnon, Murrumbeena, Ormond, and part of the suburb of St Kilda East.

The City of Glen Eira is an established residential area that is continuing to attract housing development. The City of Glen Eira contains a diversity of housing, ranging from 1880s mansions in suburbs such as Caulfield North and St Kilda East, to post-war growth areas such as Bentleigh East. The City encompasses a total land area of about 38 square kilometres.

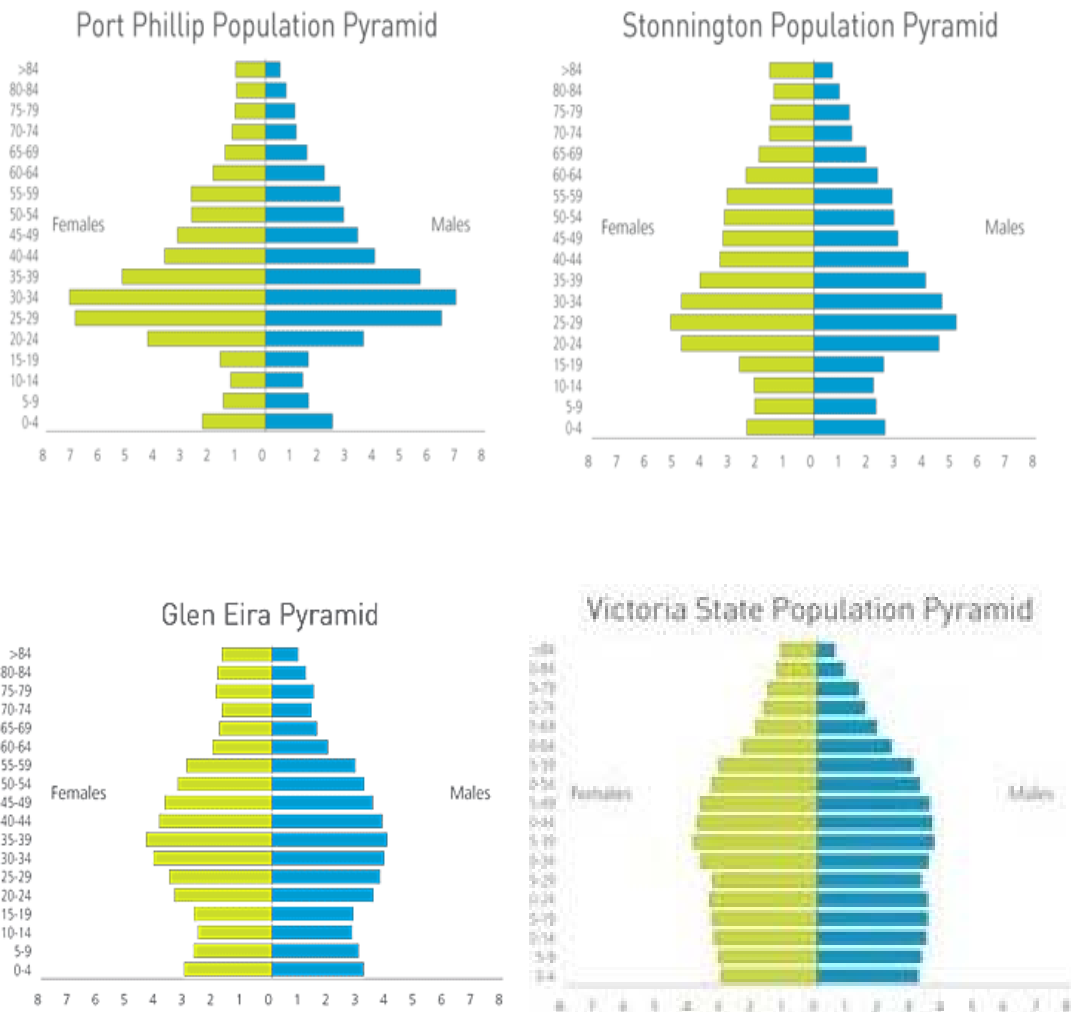

The population pyramids indicate that, as compared to Victoria overall:

- Port Phillip has a smaller proportion of children, particularly in the 5-19 years age, although the 0-4 years group is closer to the state average. Port Phillip has a markedly higher proportion in the 20-40 years age group, and a lower proportion in age groups over 65 years.
- Stonnington has a slightly lower proportion of children than the state average, and a higher proportion in the 20-35 age groups, but the difference is not as marked as in Port Phillip. Stonnington has slightly lower proportion in the 60-75 age range, but interestingly appears to have above average proportions over 80 years.
- Glen Eira has a similar population distribution to Victoria in age groups below 70, though slightly fewer in the 5-19 years age groups. Glen Eira has higher than average proportions of in all age groups over 70 years.

These projections suggest that by **2011** (this year has been chosen because it is the most relevant to the ISEPICH 2009-12 plan):

- Numbers in all age groups in Port Phillip will increase, except those 75 years and over. The proportion of older adults (55-74 years) will increase slightly and the proportion of people 75 years and over will decrease slightly.
- In Stonnington, the number of children is predicted to decline while numbers in other groups increase. The proportion of younger adults will decline while proportions of older adults and people over 75 increase slightly.
- In Glen Eira, the numbers and proportions of children and people over 70 years are predicted to decrease. Numbers in other age groups will increase. The proportion of the population aged 51-69 years will increase slightly.

These projections are dependant on a range of factors including demographic change and housing affordability and actual patterns of course may vary.
