Respect and remembrance at heart of We-Akon Dilinja ceremony

St Kilda's spectacular foreshore will be the backdrop for the dawn We-Akon Dilinja mourning reflection ceremony on Australia Day, 26 January.

This moving ceremony will be presented at Alfred Square from 5.45 am by the Boonwurrung Land and Sea Council (BLSC) in partnership with Port Phillip Council. Support is also provided by the National Australia Day Council.

BLSC N'arweet Jason Briggs said everyone is invited to respect and acknowledge the many thousands of years of the Boonwurrung People's continuing culture and connection to the land and waters traditionally known as Yuroke.

"The theme this year is Respect, Remembrance and Revival. The mourning ceremony will celebrate through song and performance the resilience of the Boonwurrung People and invite fellow citizens to share the acknowledgement of the past and present - acknowledging what we can learn from the past, rather than being chained by it, in order to create a better future," he said.

"We-Akon Dilinja is an opportunity for all Australians to redefine what it means to be Australian. If we all want solutions, we first have to identify the real problems and work together to achieve effective outcomes for a fairer and more inclusive nation."

Mayor Heather Cunsolo said Port Phillip was the first council in Australia to support a ceremony of this kind. "We are very proud to be part of the fifth year of this commemorative event which draws more attendees every year to hear this important message of respect and reconciliation."

St Kilda open for business over summer during plaza works

Luna Park and the Palais Theatre are continuing to operate as works are undertaken in the surrounding precinct to create a new pedestrian plaza.



There are changes to traffic conditions and access to the precinct as construction is underway to build a safer and more welcoming public space for the two Melbourne icons.

The revitalisation project will provide greater protection against hostile vehicles, while the creation of a shared zone on Cavell Street will reduce vehicle speed and prioritise pedestrians.

The new community-centred space will also include seating, new public lighting and additional shade from new trees and garden beds.

Port Phillip Council Mayor Heather Cunsolo reminded residents and visitors that it's business as usual at Luna Park and the Palais Theatre as the surrounding precinct receives a makeover.

"You may see temporary fencing and construction work near two of our most beloved locations," she said. "But that won't silence the screams of joy and laughter you'll hear from inside Luna Park or the excitement of people streaming out of the Palais Theatre after an incredible night of live music."

Construction will take place over several stages with different traffic conditions implemented.

Council is delivering the project in partnership with the Victorian Government. Works are expected to be completed by mid-2024.

Creating a safer and more inviting space is vital given the hundreds of thousands of visitors St Kilda attracts in the peak season.

Council's Summer Southside campaign is in full swing and, as the weather heats up, so does the fun in St Kilda.

There are several exciting events happening in St Kilda this summer, including:

- the return of the iconic St Kilda Festival on 17 18 February with two days of incredible live music
- the Midsumma Festival (21 January 11 February) and Midsumma Pride March, which will turn Fitzroy Street into a sea of colour on 4 February in a celebration of the LGBTIQA+ community
- Sunset Market, a new pop-up makers market, landing in Acland Street in the new year
- the popular KIIS Eye Ferris Wheel returning to Catani Gardens, offering stunning 360-degree views of Melbourne and Port Phillip Bay

- Cavell Street will be open to pedestrians during St Kilda Festival on 17 18 February to help large crowds access the Festival, foreshore and St Kilda area.
- Vehicle and pedestrian access to Luna Park, Palais Theatre and Cavell Street car park will always be accessible via Jacka Boulevard throughout the duration of works.
- Any temporary road or footpath closures will be advised in advance.
- Noise associated with construction works will be limited to standard working hours.

Our Council Officers were also out in force assisting Victoria Police in maintaining the peace and enforcing local restrictions, including the citywide New Year's alcohol ban.

With the 26 January public holiday quickly approaching, it's important that we all continue to play our part for a safe and successful summer.

A citywide alcohol ban will be in effect from 8 pm 25 January to 12 midday 27 January. During this time, unsealed containers of alcohol will not be permitted in any public areas. All other alcohol bans will continue to apply during this time too.

Anyone wanting to have an alcoholic beverage can still do so at licensed venues or on private property.

With summer expected to heat up and El Nino weather patterns being forecast; we're planning for a burst of revellers to make their way to Port Phillip for the Australia Day long weekend.

Police and Local Law Officers will once again be out in force patrolling, and we ask everyone to keep up the great work in continuing to comply with local restrictions following the success of New Year's.

Caring for new mums

Caring Mums is on a mission to help ensure no woman is alone as she travels on her journey through motherhood.

The National Council of Jewish Women of Australia (NCJWA) provides emotional support and reassurance during a time of change for all mothers through its Caring Mums program.



NCJWA is calling out for more Caring Mums volunteers who want to help make a difference in empowering and enriching the lives of mothers.

Long-time volunteer Emily has been paired with six different mums over her journey with Caring Mums.

"I help mothers in need to go through the ups and downs on the start of their motherhood journey. It's a great way to give back and a really satisfying role."

Emily said she wished she had a Caring Mums volunteer to provide support throughout her own journey in early motherhood.

"Mums these days get so much advice and opinions from different people, social media and everywhere around them," she said. "I love to play a role where I'm not there to advise but just be a non-judgmental ear to listen."

Caring Mums are trained, volunteer mothers, who provide ongoing support for mothers from all kinds of diverse backgrounds, including those seeking asylum or may be facing physical or mental health issues.

"The transition into motherhood can be an exciting and challenging time and mums shouldn't have to feel alone or isolated in this process. It's always great to have someone in your corner that is there just for you," Emily said.

NCJWA is always on the lookout for new volunteers to support mothers with the program providing training and personal development opportunities for volunteers.

"I feel like the training from Caring Mums has made me a better person, mum, friend and a listener," Emily said.

"It's the most incredible, fulfilling program and the more support and volunteers we get, the more lives we can impact."

Caring Mums is a free, confidential, non-denominational service that is welcoming of all new mothers in Port Phillip and surrounding council areas.
