Executive Summary

Of the 354 responses from both the short and long survey:

• Respondents were asked, 'How frequently do you usually attend events in the City of Port Phillip'. The majority of respondents said "about once a month" (18.3%) and "about every three to four months" (18.3%) followed by "about twice a year" (16.6%).

• When asked 'what types of events would you most like to see held in the City of Port Phillip', most respondents (49.6%) said "food and beverage" and "music" followed by "market" (49.3%) and "arts" (41.9%).

• When asked, 'what would encourage you to attend more events in the City of Port Phillip', most respondents (52.7%) said "more information about what is on / when" followed by "different types of events" (45.3%), "lower cost/free events" (38.2%) and "better parking availability" (30.6%).

Introduction

Developing the Events Strategy

The Port Phillip municipality is historically recognised as Melbourne's playground; a natural gathering point for the City due to its unique places, people and cultural heritage. Never has this been truer than today, when the municipality, and particularly its foreshore, is highly sought-after real estate for events. Port Phillip's assets, both natural and built - along with its proximity to the CBD and its renowned hospitality centres - make it one of Melbourne's gathering places. Council's own proud history of producing local and world-class events with extraordinary levels of participation and engagement combine with the municipality's popularity as an event site to bring the City of Port Phillip an enviable position within metropolitan Melbourne.

Council is developing a new Events Strategy that will help the City to deliver and attract the best events, activate the right places, and partner with the right organisations. The City of Port Phillip aims to plan, attract, and direct events to ensure our City is welcoming, healthy, safe, and vibrant for all.

Engagement approach

For the Events Strategy Council has chosen a two phased engagement approach:

- Priority setting: During this phase we want to understand the community's needs and priorities for community events. Initial feedback will inform the development of the draft Events Strategy.
- 2. Feedback on the Draft Events Strategy: Community can review and give feedback on the draft strategy.

This report focuses on findings of the engagement phase which ran from 8 February 2022 to 2 March 2022, and included:

- A hard copy post card with a link to the Have Your Say page was given out at various locations around Port Phillp.
- A short survey was conducted face to face by staff at the following locations:
 - St Kilda (Carlisle St, Acland St, foreshore)
 - o Albert Park (Bridport St)
 - Middle Park (Armstrong St)
 - o Elwood (Ormond Rd, foreshore)
 - o South Melbourne (South Melbourne Market, Clarendon St)
 - Port Melbourne (Bay St, foreshore)
 - Ripponlea (Glen Eira Rd)
- An online engagement page on Have Your Say.
- An Q&A on Have Your Say, where the community ask questions and get answers. Council staff provide answers and additional resources to help the community understand the project in a digital conversation style.

These activities were designed to provide an understanding of the key areas of interest to the Port Phillip community for Councillors to consider during determination of the new events strategy.

Purpose of this report

The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of community engagement on the draft Events Strategy. It details the engagement techniques used and presents the findings from this engagement program.

Purpose of engagement

The purpose of this engagement program was to inform the community of the development of the Events Strategy and to provide feedback to inform strategic directions for the strategy for further community feedback.

Limitations

Limitations to the community engagement process include:

- Informed feedback is dependent on people having read the draft documents.
- Contributions to this engagement program do not necessarily constitute a wholly representative snapshot of our community as people self-selected to participate.

Data Methodology

Data was collated in Excel. Where possible, data was analysed quantitatively and put into a graph. When analysing the qualitative data from open-ended questions, attention was given to the variety of responses, as well as identifying common themes through qualitative responses.

Caution should be taken in considering this information as statistically significant or representative given the small sample size versus statistically vaild random sample of the population.

Survey Results

Short Survey

The short survey was completed by 269 people. The short survey was conducted face to face by staff out at various locations around Port Phillip.

Q: How frequently do you usually attend events in the City of Port Phillip?




Figure 1: How frequently do you usually attend events in the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 269

Respondents were asked, 'How frequently do you usually attend events in the City of Port Phillip'. The majority of respondents said, "about once a month" (19%) followed "less than once a year" (15.6%), "about twice a year" (14.5%) and about "every three to four months" (14.1%) (see figure 1). (n= 269 responses).

Q: What types of events would you most like to see held in the City of Port Phillip? (select all that apply)




Figure 2: What types of events would you most like to see held in the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 269

When asked 'what types of events would you most like to see held in the City of Port Phillip', most respondents (49.4%) said "market" followed by "food and beverage" (47.6%), "music" (45.7%) and *arts* (36.1%) (see figure 2). (n= 269 responses).

Q: What would encourage you to attend more events in the City of Port Phillip? (select all that apply)





Figure 3: What would encourage you to attend more events in the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 269

When asked 'what would encourage you to attend more events in the City of Port Phillip', most respondents (55%) said "more information about what is on / when" followed by "different types of events" (42.4%), "lower cost / free events" (39.4%) and "better parking availability" (36.4%) (see figure 3) (n= 269 responses).

Our long survey was completed by 85 people. The long survey was online on Council's engagement website Have Your Say.






Figure 3: Have you been aware of, or attended any events held in the City of Port Phillip in the last twelve months?

Q: What types of events were you aware of, and which if any did you attend in the last twelve months? (select all that apply)





Figure 4: What types of events were you aware of, and which if any did you attend in the last twelve months? Number of responses: 79

Respondents were asked 'what types of events were you aware of, and which if any did you attend in the last twelve months'. Surprisingly both *educational* and *fundraising* had very high awareness but very low attended. *Arts, entertainment* and *music* similar percentages for both awareness and attended (see figure 4). (n= 79 responses).




Q: What are all the ways by which you usually hear about events in the City of Port Phillip? (select all that apply)






Figure 8: How likely are you to attend the same events in the City of Port Phillip in the next twelve months as you did in the last twelve months? Number of responses: 79

When asked 'how likely are you to attend the same events in the City of Port Phillip in the next twelve months as you did in the last twelve months?', most respondents (45.6%) said "very likely" followed by "somewhat likely" (27.9%) (see figure 8). (n= 79 responses).




Figure 11: Do you think the number of events held in the City of Port Phillip is? Number of responses: 83






Figure 12: Do you think the number of events held in the City of Port Phillip is? Number of responses: 84





Figure 14: What types of events would you most like to see held in the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 82





Figure 15: What, if any do you think are the biggest impacts to you and your local area of events being held in the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 85



Q: Does attending events in the City of Port Phillip make you feel part of your local community?


Figure 16: Does attending events in the City of Port Phillip make you feel part of your local community?

Q: Which of the following describes your connection to the City of Port Phillip?


Figure 17: Which of the following describes your connection to the City of Port Phillip? Number of responses: 85


Figure 18: What is your residential suburb? Number of responses: 84
