### Monthly Program Spotlight

Over December and January, twenty-one people who had experienced rough sleeping homelessness in Port Phillip have moved into Madden House. The remaining five rooms will be occupied over the following months. Madden House is a property which has on-site wraparound support services to help people with complex needs to thrive and stay in housing. Council proudly partnered with the Victorian Government, through Homes Victoria, and St Kilda Community Housing to help bring Madden House, named after former SKCH Chair Paul Madden, to life.
