From the Chamber

As we head towards the holiday season, I want to thank the countless community members who contributed to our City over 2023.

St Kilda Festival 2024 was the main topic of my last column and I'm delighted to share it was another big success.

About 330,000 music lovers enjoyed more than 60 acts over the weekend - as well as experiencing many of our fantastic local venues.



We were also delighted to receive very positive feedback from venues about our first Friday night live music "curtain raiser" to Australia's most popular free music festival.

The festival fun is beautifully captured in a video at www.stkildafestival.com.au – we can't wait for 2025's event.

With the Grand Prix around the corner, this issue of Divercity has some great suggestions about where to wine and dine nearby. We are also joining with Experience South Melbourne for the return of the popular Porsche and Coffee Meet. Adding to the theme, a fantastic open day at the Emerald Hill Library will include fun racing activities for our younger residents.

As foreshadowed last month, we considered a proposal to withdraw from in-home aged care services at a recent Council Meeting.

While that proposal was endorsed, we will retain services such as meal deliveries and are introducing a Community Connector role to help older residents navigate the aged care system under a new Village Model. This was a difficult decision but we believe our plan will ensure the

smoothest possible transition to new providers.

Council decisions so far this month include endorsing our Advocacy Strategy for 2024-27. This will assist us being a voice for our community, including when seeking funding for local projects.

We recognised recently retired Team Leader Libraries Kay Rowan's impressive 48 years' service at our 6 March meeting. Kay began working with the City of Port Phillip at the South Melbourne Library in 1976 and played a vital role in establishing the Heritage Collection, Port Phillip Heritage Centre and local history services.

We are always looking at how we can add to Port Phillip's history resources so we were proud to launch our HerStory illustrated map on International Women's Day. HerStory displays places where women are recognised and honoured in street names, parks and gardens. It's just the beginning so please let us know if you have suggestions about women whose significant efforts should be commemorated.

There are so many stories to tell in our City, and we love hearing about them.

Acland St activation opening doors

The Acland Street Vacant Shop Project is up and running with two tenants signed up and more announcements expected soon.

Our Council continues to encourage participants, including landlords, to partner with us and take advantage of this opportunity.

Kerrin, a premium casual menswear business, has already opened its doors at 104 Acland Street and The Naughty Vegan chocolate shop is preparing to move in to 96 Acland Street.

Kerrin Schuppan says: "Acland Street is a symbol of Melbourne's vibrant culture and history, now on the cusp of an exciting renewal. As one of the first participants in the Acland Street Vacant Shop Project, we're thrilled to introduce our premium casual menswear to this beloved bayside locale.

Our pop-up shop is more than a retail space; it's a hub for engaging with our customers, showcasing the craftsmanship and passion behind our designs, and contributing to the local community spirit."

The Naughty Vegan's plans for its Acland Street pop-up include tastings and offering a vibrant, fun experience for a range of dietaries requirements, such gluten free dairy free. Made in Melbourne with 100 per cent Belgian chocolate, The Naughty Vegan is committed to bringing the joy of chocolate to everyone with their vegan mylk product.

The vacant shop project aims to help revitalise this high-profile St Kilda high street by filling vacant shops with businesses which complement existing offers. Our consultants Plan 1 and Ginnane & Associates are working with the Acland Street Village Business Association, landlords, local stakeholders and operators to offer eligible tenants up to 12-month leases at below market rates.

This included a recent stakeholder event at Kerrin's for prospective landlords, real estate agents and tenants to ask questions and see the high quality fit-outs which can be achieved.

Social housing on the way for St Kilda

Construction has started to develop 26 social housing units at 28 Wellington Street, St Kilda, to support some of Port Phillip's most vulnerable residents.

We are partnering with the Victorian Government and St Kilda Community Housing to deliver a three-storey building featuring 24/7 on-site support services as part of the Common Ground housing model.

Our Council is contributing \$5.1 million towards the project including donating surplus land under our In Our Backyard affordable housing strategy. The Victorian Government, through Homes Victoria, is contributing \$12.1 million in capital and operating funding while St Kilda Community Housing will deliver and manage this important initiative.

Mayor Heather Cunsolo (pictured right) joined Victorian Member for the Southern Metropolitan Region John Berger, officially representing Housing Minister Harriet Shing, and St Kilda Community Housing Chair Liz Johnstone for a ceremonial sod turn at the site.

This project continues our history of championing social justice by providing a safe and permanent place to call home for those in need. This includes community members facing housing stress, homelessness or those at risk of becoming homeless.

When completed in 2025, the Wellington Street Common Ground Project units will operate using the evidence-based 'housing first' approach that places people experiencing homelessness directly into permanent and safe housing where on-site support services can address complex needs.

The new residents will have the opportunity to access those services to improve aspects of their lives from health and well-being to independent living and job skills.

Electoral ward changes

Following an independent review from an electoral representation advisory panel, the City of Port Phillip will move to a single member ward structure for the October 2024 election.



This is in line with the recommendations in the Local Government Act 2020, and we join 39 other councils moving to the single ward structure.

This means the City of Port Phillip will move from having three wards with three councillors per ward, to nine wards with one councillor per ward.

To ensure fair and equitable representation of all voters, each ward has approximately equal

number of voters.

The new wards will be named:

Alma Park East upgrade

With the support of the Victorian Government's Suburban Parks Program, alongside an investment from our Council, Alma Park East has been revitalised into a natural oasis for our community to enjoy.

We've installed a new barbecue plaza, complemented by upgraded furniture and a water play feature for visitors of all ages and abilities. We also redesigned pathways to make it easier for people with disabilities.



We also collaborated with ecologists to safeguard the balance of indigenous flora and fauna. Notably, the preservation of a thriving population of Southern Brown Tree Frogs makes the natural ecosystem of Alma Park East rare in a city environment.

Celebrating diversity

Our City is celebrating Cultural Diversity Week from 18-24 March and everyone is invited to enjoy the jam-packed program.

This year's theme is Our Shared Stories – Celebrating Together, which asks us to reflect on our own experiences and recognise how each story has the potential to create shared connections and understanding.

Events and activities include:

Festival Africa at St Kilda's Space2b, a family-friendly day of rhythm, flavour and community spirit. The celebration includes free drumming lessons, a market and an art exhibition.

Eighteen of our City's multicultural seniors groups coming together to host a spectacular afternoon filled with stories, music, food, art, movement and more.

You can also celebrate the inclusive multicultural heritage of Port Phillip by following the immigration trail starting from Station Pier.

Events at our libraries include a classical Indian music performance by Vinod and Anubrata . A Greek interpreter will be present for an author talk by George Kyriakou on seven generations of culture, conflict, compassion and understanding.

An afternoon of family-friendly activities celebrating our community's diverse cultures will be hosted at the St Kilda library on 23 March, including craft activities with Space 2b and Cool Capoeira.

New takes on Port Phillip history

A history of St Kilda's "golden age" (1841-1900) has taken out the top prize at the prestigious Victorian Community History Awards.

In a golden moment for Port Phillip projects, two other local entries were recognised at the awards night at the Arts Centre Melbourne.

St Kilda East resident Carmel McKenzie was awarded the Victorian Premier's History Award for her book St Kilda 1841-1900: Movers and Shakers and Money-Makers, detailing how St Kilda was a bastion of aristocratic privilege prior to the 1890s.

The judges described the book as "a beautifully presented and profusely illustrated social history".

St Kilda's Richard Lowenstein, and Martie Lowenstein, won the Oral History Award for Don't Be Too Polite Girls, a documentary about oral history pioneer Wendy Lowenstein.

The Middle Park and Albert Park History Group won a commendation for their book Albert Park: Gardens to the Sea.

The Victorian Community History Awards are held in celebration of activities undertaken to explore and preserve the State's history.

The range of award categories acknowledge that history can be told in many and varied formats with the aim of reaching and enriching all Victorians.
