Additional information

There are 61 people active on the Port Phillip By Name List (BNL), which is 5 more than last month. Of the 61 people currently active on BNL, 28 were sleeping rough (including in squats and vehicles); 10 identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and 12 people were over 55.

The Rough Sleepers Initiative (RSI) has reported contact with 35 individual people experiencing rough sleeping homelessness in Port Phillip in May 2024. RSI assertive outreach workers delivered 151 episodes of contact in 30.5 hours directly working with these people.

Council continues to support a coordinated response to Rough Sleeping homelessness. This involves Council's Housing and Homelessness services, City Amenity and Indigenous Policy and partnering with community organisations and Police.

Council's Housing & Homelessness Services also delivered 58 hours of assistance to 48 older individuals at risk of or experiencing homelessness and assisted 6 people to be housed.
