Celebrating 25 years of Friendships

2025 is the anniversary of the Friendships which were formed to support Timorese communities after the devastation when the Indonesians left in 1999. The movement grew to about 40 friendships, each with a distinct focus of activity and way of working. Sadly a number of these groups have been unable to survive due to lack of funding and an ageing membership.

The first friendships formed were Friends of Suai, Friends of Aileu and Friends of Baucau, each with Friendship Agreements signed by Xanana Gusmão when he was in Melbourne on 4 May 2000. A special event will be held to celebrate this occasion at Coburg Town Hall, involving councillors from all three councils, on 6 May.

A Friendship Conference for the 25th Anniversary will be held in Dili. It is being organised jointly by the Ministry of State Administration in Dili and the Australia Timor Leste Friendship Network in Australia. FoSC will have a small participation of self-funded members together with a delegation from the CCC from Suai.

International Women's Day celebration

Each year the Rural Women's Development Program team at the CCC, funded by IWDA, organise a commemorative event to celebrate International Women's Day. Last year the team decided to extend their outreach by holding forums in more remote sub-districts of Covalima. This year a forum was held in Faturmean with a range of speakers presenting under the theme 'Women are ready to lead in all areas'. Guest speakers included CCC Commission President Sgt Amelia de Jesus Amaral (pictured) who spoke passionately about gender equality. More than 170 people attended the forum and positive feedback was received.

Rai Matak (With One Seed) expansion

The Rai Matak team at the CCC continue to work with subsistence farmers in Tilomar sub-district to plant and maintain trees. In 2025, Rai Matak is expanding into the two sub-districts of Fatumea and Fatululic. New staff have been recruited and are undergoing extensive training from the Rai Matak team in Dili and Baguia. The Rai Matak have begun extensive community engagement in the new areas to ensure that communities fully understand the initiative. Locations for nurseries are also being sourced. We look forward to sharing more information on this fantastic initiative which is bringing much needed income into subsistence farming communities.
