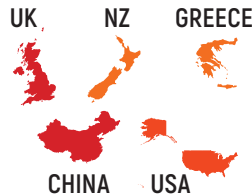


1. Our diversity

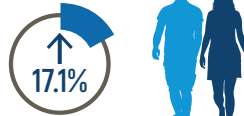
