What you need to do for your application

Complete the form

Make sure all sections are complete. Remember only microchipped animals can be registered.



Bring supporting documents

To ensure we can process your application make sure you bring all applicable documentation.



Receive your tag

We will issue a tag on the spot for in person applications, otherwise we will mail your pets tag to you.

Pet registration is a legal requirement under the Domestic Animals Act 1994.

Registration period

Registration period runs from 10 April to 9 April. Renewal is due on the 10 April each year.

Service dog free registration

Guide dog / customs dog certificate required.

Transfer of registration

Provide proof of your paid 2020/2021 registration from your former city of residence to transfer registration to City of Port Phillip.

Free registration criteria

Your pet must be microchipped and registered within four (4) weeks of you taking ownership. Supporting documentation must be provided with your application, for example; invoice, adoption certificate/agreement, microchip change of ownership form that states date of purchase.

State Government Levy

The State Government Levy of \$4 for dog and cat registration is used to help fund responsible pet ownership education programs.

Restricted breed

From 1 November 2002, the **Domestic Animals Act 1994** introduced specific restrictions for the keeping of Restricted Breed Dogs. State Government has made legislation to restrict the American Pit Bull Terrier, Pit Bull Terrier, Dogo Argentino, Japanese Tosa, Fila Brasileiro, Perro De Presa Canario.
