

PROPOSED ROAD DISCONTINUANCE – KERFERD ROAD & HERBERT / MONTAGUE STREET, ALBERT PARK INTERSECTION ("SHRINE TO SEA PROJECT")

PUBLIC NOTICE INVITING SUBMISSIONS UNDER SECTION 223

Port Phillip City Council (Council), gives notice under Clause 3 of Schedule 10 of the Local Government Act 1989 (the Act) that Council proposes to discontinue the Kerferd Road, Herbert / Montague Streets, Albert Park intersection, shown shaded red (Montague Street) on the image below. For public safety reasons, this intersection was temporarily closed to traffic in February 2021.



The permanent removal of this intersection is being proposed in line with the State Government's planned "Shrine to Sea" Project, which has identified this portion of Road for public recreation purposes.

Council gives public notice of the proposal pursuant to Sections 207A and 223 of the Act. Interested parties are invited to lodge a written submission to Council by 5.00 pm Thursday, 18 September 2025.

Submissions should be submitted via Council's website or addressed to Kate Psomotragos and posted to Port Phillip City Council, Private Bag 3, St Kilda VIC 3182. Submissions can also be hand delivered to 99A Carlisle Street, St Kilda VIC 3182. All submissions will be considered in accordance with section 223 of the Act. No further community consultation will be undertaken.

Any person making a submission is entitled to request in the submission that the person wishes to appear in person, or to be represented by a person specified in the submission, at a meeting of Council or a Committee of Council at a date, time and place determined by Council.

Any person making a written submission under section 223 of the Act is advised that all submissions and personal information in the submission will be handled by Council in accordance with the provisions of the Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014. Following consideration of submissions, Council may resolve not to discontinue the road or to discontinue the road and have it reserved for public recreation purposes.
