- The annual trimmed mean inflation was 3.2% in the December quarter, the lowest in 3 years, down from 3.6% in the September quarter. (ABS)
- The unemployment rate (Victoria) was 4.4% in December, the highest of any state or territory. The national rate was 4% (ABS, seasonally adjusted)
- Job vacancies (Victoria) decreased by 2.2% in the three months to November 2024, following a 5.3% fall over the quarter to May 2024. Western Australia was the only other state or territory to record a fall (-0.1%) (ABS)
- Retail turnover rose in all states and territories. Victoria recorded a 0.7% rise in retail turnover in October and 0.8% in November. Australian retail turnover rose 0.5% in October and 0.8% in November (ABS, seasonally adjusted)
- "Black Friday sales events proved once again to be a big hit, with widespread discounting and higher spending across all retail industries." (Robert Ewing, ABS, November 2024)
- Household spending in November rose in all states and territories expect for Tasmania and the ACT. The strongest increases were in Queensland (+0.7%) and Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia (+0.5%) (ABS, seasonally adjusted)
