Dili Friendship Conference

Megs Alston and Ann Wigglesworth represented Friends of Suai Covalima at the Australian East Timor Friendship Conference held in Dili on July 10 and 11, together with Alberto Barros and 3 other staff from the CCC. Several staff from the Municipal Administration office in Suai were also there. Long time Friends of Suai supporter and local resident Jean McLean AO, vice president of the Australian East Timor Association also joined the Covalima group.

There were 80 Australian friendship members who attended and over 200 East Timorese.

Highlights included a reception held at the Australian Ambassador's residence, and conference addresses by President Jose Ramos-Horta who reflected on his long connection with Australia, Minister Agio Pereira who lived in Australia for 20 years prior to independence and the Australian Ambassador Caitlin Wilson. It was a great opportunity to hear about developments in East Timor, catch up with other friendship groups, hear presentations about their work and connect with old friends.

Timor-Leste Awards

program for another 5 years and our Friendship Group will continue to raise funds within the Port Phillip community to support the program.

The Rai Matak reforestation program continues to expand and thrive. Last financial year farmers were paid to maintain almost 48,000 trees and the program hopes this will increase to 70,000 trees by December 2025.
