## Alcohol ban over Australia Day break

A City-wide alcohol ban applies across Port Phillip's public spaces from 8 pm 25 January to 12 midday 27 January.

The annual St Kilda foreshore alcohol ban, which started on 1 November, continues until 31 March.

These bans are enforced by Victoria Police with support from our Local Law officers. Breaching the ban risks a \$204 fine.

## Library Visit

### Classic Kitchens

Pop into the Port Phillip Heritage Centre (Emerald Hill Library) for a fascinating exhibit about one of Port Melbourne's most iconic factories.

While John Kitchen and Sons used a number of titles over the years, it was always "Kitchens" to Port Melbourne residents.

From the 1860s to early 21st century, the factory was one of the largest employers of labour in the district. The exhibit provides insights into factory life, employee welfare, innovation and industry until 24 March.
