The Everybody's Home Plan

There's more to making housing work for everyone than real estate pages and avocados.

There are 5 things our government can do to fix the broken system and make sure everybody has a place to call home.

- 1** Develop a National Housing Strategy to meet Australia's identified shortfall of 500,000 social and affordable rental homes. We need more homes for communities, not for profits.
- 2** Reset the tax system to prioritise homebuyers over property speculators and encourage investment in social and affordable rental housing, using the billions the government would save by removing tax breaks around housing.
- 3** Nationally consistent protection for renters through legislative protections against rent rises, discrimination and landlords who refuse to maintain properties.
- 4** Immediate relief for people in housing stress by increasing rent assistance
- 5** Commit to ending homelessness by 2030 by taking action to prevent homelessness and delivering rapid access to the housing and support people need if they do lose their own home.

Australians know that housing affordability is a problem for everyone. Everybody's Home is asking all parties to support the solutions.
