Proposal to name a reserve, a forecourt and two lanes at Emerald Hill, South Melbourne

Council is undertaking statutory procedures to name a reserve, a forecourt and two lanes at Emerald Hill, South Melbourne.

- The reserve at 26-34 Emerald Hill Place is proposed to be named "Edythe McCallum Reserve".
- The forecourt in front of the Emerald Hill Library and Heritage Centre is proposed to be named "Harold Alexander Forecourt".
- The lane R2857 that runs along the northern edge of the reserve between Emerald Hill Place and Perrins Street is proposed to be named "Doris Condon Lane".
- The lane R2853 that runs alongside the southern edge of the reserve between Emerald Hill Place and Perrins Street is proposed to be named "Tom Uren Lane".
